

From the Rector: Revd Tom Benson

Dear friends,

Traditionally, September is a time of hard work for lots of us, especially our teachers and pupils and for parents as they rush to get school uniforms and shoes in time for the start of term. This year it is also a very unsettling time as we are faced with a number of issues that we seem to have little control over. As I write this, we are in a drought, we have had wildfires and record temperatures and looming inflation at a level that we have not seen in decades. The war in Ukraine has now being going on for over six months and so we continue to support and pray for an end to that appalling situation. We can easily feel overwhelmed at the scale of the issues both worldwide and right on our doorstep.

I am reminded of a quote from Edmund Burke 'The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good people to do nothing'. It seems to me that there is a lot of power in this statement, too often we focus on what we can't do, what we can't achieve, how things seem like they are simply too big, too much for us to take on. However, doing what we can as best we can is 'not doing nothing'. We are in a time where looking after our neighbours (near and far) is brought into focus, if only to remind us that we are not alone. So whatever the next few months have in store for us, we look up and out, keeping an eye out for situations where we can add our support, not forgetting the power of the little acts of kindness upon which the world turns.

An anonymous author wrote a poem about taking time for God and I would like to sign off with this-

Take time to think; it is the source of power.

Take time to read; it is the foundation of wisdom.

Take time to play; it is the secret of staying young.

Take time to be quiet; it is the opportunity to seek God.

Take time to be aware; it is the opportunity to help others.

Take time to love and be loved; it is God's greatest gift.

Ride & Stride Day supports our Churches & Chapels in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight This event happens nationally.

Despite Covid the Ride & Stride Participants raised nearly £62,000 for the Trust which will enable it to help our churches even more.

More youngsters joining in as well as clergy encouraging their benefice churches to participate all helped. Those churches that did were able to also raise some much needed funds themselves – 50% of the sponsorship money for a nominated church was returned to them!

The Trust keeps the other half plus any gift aid to hand out in grants to our churches on appplication. All Saints, Braishfield benefited this year from a grant for repairs to the tower and clock. Our Grants Committee are very supportive of churches to the extent that they sometimes offer advice!

In addition, we are extraordinarily grateful to Hampshire County Council for their generous support of the Trust with a £25,000 grant annually. The Trust is also run entirely by volunteers so almost all the money raised goes to our churches.



Stained Glass at All Saints' Awbridge

I was intrigued to notice that the stained glass window of St. George and the dragon, commemorating the second world war, was



designed by the well-regarded artist George Cooper-Abbs. His name and the distinctive monogram of J.Wippell & Co. are visible at the bottom right of the window. George Cooper-Abbs (1901-1966) studied at the renowned Camberwell School of Art and was taught by William Aikman, founder of the British Society of Master Glass Painters (1921). He was employed by the London-based glass-makers James Powell and Sons (of Whitefriars glass fame) from 1917-1919 and again from 1928 to 1932, after which he settled in Exeter, designing glass for many

churches around the UK (notably in Shropshire, Gloucestershire, Cornwall and Buckinghamshire) and also in Paris. His designs were fabricated by the company of J. Wippell & Co for whom he worked in Exeter. The firm of Wippell continues today and is renowned for the supply of academic and clerical garments.

The large window behind the altar at All Saints is also significant and clearly a well-designed piece from the pre-Raphaelite period. The sunflowers depicted reflect the aesthetic taste of the time. The window bears the name C.J.Baguley, Newcastle-on-Tyne and dates from about 1890.

Somborne with Ashley – in a 'group' with us. An update.

Looking back at Five Alive from a year ago, there's an account of Rev Tom Benson's licensing service on Thursday 29th July at St Mary's Michelmersh. What an occasion that was! We had only just been permitted to meet in larger numbers: limited representatives of the parishes – wearing masks and using only every other row of seats. Friends not seen for some time greeted across the church from afar! The excellent refreshments afterwards, mainly in the fresh air outside the Barns, found people mingling in a way to which they were unaccustomed. There was a real air of celebration, and it was a great start to Tom's ministry and welcome to the Benson family, with 12 churchwardens entitled to take part, two per church!

Tom came to be Rector of our five parishes, and Priest-in-Charge of Somborne with Ashley. King's Somborne had been in a 'group' with us for several years, with the Area Dean holding the post of Priest-in-Charge, so we were mostly unaware of the arrangement. The Rev Richard Burningham, as resident House-for-Duty priest in the parish of Somborne with Ashley, took most of the services there, and was responsible for the pastoral work. Tom, together with Jane Thompson and Richard, was licensed to work in all 6 parishes of the group, as need arose. The plan was to introduce a few more shared activities as time went on.

Sadly, and as many are aware, during the last year Richard became seriously ill, and in late May he died. When Richard became unwell, Tom and Jane began to give extra support to our sixth parish, and for many months have between them taken an 8am Holy Communion service at King's Somborne on the 1st Sunday of each month, as well as taking the Parish Communion at 10am on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. The wardens arrange cover for other Sunday services. Jane has become a Foundation Governor, representing the church, at King's Somborne C of E school, and at the moment Tom takes the majority of baptisms, weddings and funerals, assisted by Jane. That's the benefit of being in a group – there are people ready to step in and help when it's needed.

The parish of Somborne with Ashley is now in vacancy. The PCC is updating their Parish Profile, and they hope to be able to recruit a new House-for-Duty priest (part-time unpaid post, free house provided) by next spring. Then the group will return to its full staffing. Until then, Tom and Jane will continue to be involved regularly with the leading of worship in King's Somborne – so if they don't appear on our rota, they may well be with our friends up the road!
