

### From the Rector: Revd Tom Benson

With the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, we find ourself in a time of change. This change is unwanted, enforced, inevitable and perhaps something of a surprise, a shock. As monarch, she has been a constant in our lives for 70 years and we find ourselves at a moment of world history. Queen Elizabeth's reign covered so many world events - empires rising and falling, liberation and oppression, wars and peace; she has met innumerable world leaders and ordinary people just like us.

The Queen had a great sense of fun. Something that we perhaps saw more of in her later years. Again she handled this with such grace, and we might ask ourselves how she managed it? Her Majesty was a person who could shake hands with Ozzy Osbourne at a variety performance, handle Donald Trump with such consummate ease and dignity, and speak to us at times of trouble.

For me this dignity and leadership is summed up in the photo of the Queen wearing her mask sitting alone and socially distanced at the funeral of Prince Philip during covid times. Complying with the rules of the time. Here was a person who actually WAS above the law but who chose even in her grief to stand in solidarity with her people in theirs.

Around the world, wars continue to rage, viruses continue to infect, economies continue to rise and fall, -- as they always have. Way back in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, the poet John Keats wrote that 'There is nothing stable in the world. Uproar is your only music'. In many ways the reign of Queen Elizabeth covered the era with the most change and turmoil. Except in Her Majesty we found a constancy, a steadiness. She somehow provided an antidote to the world's uproar. She clearly regarded her role as one of duty and service, and she provided both for seven decades, without complaint. Much has been said by others and the queen herself about her faith -- as she grew older she expressed more publicly just how must she depended on God.

There is a line in Matthew's Gospel where Jesus told the Parable of the Bags of Gold, in chapter 25 verse 21, where the master greets his worker with the words 'Well done, good and faithful servant.' And it gives me great comfort to think that those could be the first words that Her Majesty heard as she left this world behind.

Her father George VI broadcast this moving poem "The Gate of the Year" by Mini Louise Haskins, in his Christmas broadcast of 1939. It was just after the Second World War had broken out. Many people of the time remember it, but few people know that it was Elizabeth herself, his 13-year-old daughter, who had found it for him and pressed it into his hand to use. It goes like this:

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.
That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."
So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.
And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

# The process to appoint the next Bishop of Winchester - and how you can be involved



On Thursday 1st September the first meeting of the Vacancy in See Committee of the Diocese of Winchester took place. The Committee is a group of 21 representatives elected and appointed from across our diocesan communities. Their task is to help feed into the discernment and appointment process for the next Bishop of Winchester.

Working in conjunction with the Archbishops' Secretary for Appointments and the Prime Minister's Appointment Secretary, the Committee is responsible for preparing a document that sets out qualities and skills needed in our next bishop in the context of the current state of the diocese. This document is known as a Statement of Needs

At our meeting, the Committee was reminded that the Statement of Needs must be underpinned by two things. The first is **listening**. To this end, we want to hear from as many individuals, groups and communities across our diocese as possible.

Specifically, we invite you to complete a short questionnaire which has been designed to help us all articulate what we hope for in our new bishop.

[Each church warden and PCC secretary has been sent the link to this on-line questionnaire. Ask them to forward it to you, or email braishfieldbenefice@gmail.com for the link.]

Every response received to the questionnaire will be read by at least three members of the Committee (including the Chair), with answers collated and analysed to help inform the Statement of Needs. Short and concise answers to the questions are requested, please.

The death of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has meant that this consultation is beginning later than we had planned. Please may we ask you, therefore, having considered the questions and prayer about your response, to complete and return the questionnaire no later than the 3rd October 2022. The sooner we have your responses, the sooner the analysis can begin.

Over the coming weeks and months, we aim to keep the diocesan community updated on the work of the Committee, whilst recognising the strict confidentiality that the process requires. Further details of the process will be shared on our website in the coming days, with regular updates shared through our weekly newsletters and social media channels.

The second vital ingredient at every stage of this process is prayer. Please pray for the Committee in the coming weeks and months, as they undertake this important task for us all.

'Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen.' (Ephesians 3.20-21)
